There are some interesting water level discussions being held at Federal and State positions regarding the water levels at Howard Prairie, Emigrant and Agate Lakes; how they tie into biological opinions, Klamath water basin, fish flows, elevation levels for safety of dams project, etc. Steve and John feel there are enough potential effects on our parks and facilities that we ask BOR to give us a presentation on water management changes and actions that might be happening in next five years as well as the next 5-10 years. Sue King, PRAC Chair will draft letter to invite BOR to attend an upcoming PRAC meeting and give report to group.
