Updated Jackson County COVID-19 Daily Press Release

[Medford, Oregon] —Jackson County Public Health reports 35 new COVID-19 cases as of 12:01 am on February 12, 2021. Additionally, six previously reported cases have been removed from the total COVID-19 cases. These updates bring the total COVID-19 cases to 7,861.

COVID-19 Hospitalizations

The number of hospitalized patients with COVID-19 in Region 5 (Jackson and Josephine Counties) is 19, increasing by 3 from the previous day. There are 4 patients in the intensive care unit (ICU), increasing by 1 from the previous day.

<u>The total number of patients in hospital beds may fluctuate between report times</u>. The numbers do not reflect admissions per day nor the length of hospital stay. Staffing limitations are not captured in this data and may further limit bed capacity.

Pfizer Second Dose Vaccination Event at the Jackson County Expo

Today is the second day of the vaccination event at the Jackson County Expo. This vaccination event aims to provide the second dose of the Pfizer vaccine for individuals vaccinated at the Jackson County Expo on January 21, 22, or 23. On February 11, 2021, 2,916 people received their second dose of the Pfizer vaccine.

This event is important because the second dose of the Pfizer vaccine increases a person's protection from getting COVID-19. Preliminary data shows the Pfizer vaccine was 95% effective at preventing COVID-19 illness in people.

This week's vaccination event at the Expo does not have the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine available. This event only has the second dose of the Pfizer vaccine available for those vaccinated at the Expo on January 21, 22, or 23. If anyone needs the second dose of the Moderna vaccine, it is best to keep their scheduled appointment with the COVID-19 vaccine provider that provided them with the first dose.

If you need your first dose, please call 211 information or access the <u>Jackson County Health and Human Services COVID-19 Vaccine Website to see where you may be able to access the vaccine</u>. "We are experiencing a vaccine shortage for first doses in Jackson County and Oregon," states Tanya Phillips, Health Promotion Manager for Jackson County Public Health. "This means it will take longer to vaccinate some of our most vulnerable populations, and it will take time to get a vaccine appointment, despite the state's prioritization saying you are currently eligible." Jackson County Public Health, Asante, Providence, and other healthcare partners are encouraged by the number of people wanting to be vaccinated, and we are all eager to provide the vaccine. We appreciate the community's patience; we are all doing the best we can – as fast as we can – with the available resources we have.

- 3. COVID-19 Vaccination Record Card: this card was provided to you after receiving your first COVID-19 vaccination at the Expo. If you do not have your vaccine card with you, we will verify your eligibility using the state immunization system called Alert)

If you are not currently eligible to be vaccinated per the Oregon prioritization or for this event, we ask that you not show up at closing hours to receive leftover vaccine. The vaccine provided at this event is the second dose of the Pfizer vaccine, first dose vaccination will not be available, and there will not be leftover vaccine. You will be turned away if you are not eligible.

Please continue to check the <u>Jackson County Health and Human Services COVID-19 Vaccine</u> website for vaccine eligibility information and where you can access the vaccine when it is your turn or utilize 211-information by calling 211.
