<p>Maureen provided a handout and update regarding the Mental Health sub-committee reflecting the highlights of the committee and the key goals.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Highlights: there has been a high level of participation and motivation by the multiple community partners. • Key goals include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Provide education in regard to community resources and the services available and procedures followed by the different agencies; ○ Development of strategies to address individuals with high law enforcement contact through the development of multi-disciplinary teams and more efficient screening at the jail; ○ Provide a community outreach program through the Department of Justice Community Justice/Mental Health Grant; and ○ Explore the possibility of enhancing community crisis response. <p>Maureen also identified that there is a severe lack of resources for adolescents who need psychological care within the Valley.</p>	

PRESENTATION – MRIPA

GAIL HEDDING & DOUG FLOW

DISCUSSION	
<p>Gail Hedding and Doug Flow from the Mid Rogue Independent Physician Association, Inc. (MRIPA) provided a presentation on the impact of HB 3650 and SB 1580 on the Oregon Health Plan and how this legislation affects the community. The current system (Oregon Health Plan) is identified as being inefficient with no positive outcomes in which 80% of the money allocated to this program is spent on roughly 20% of the patients. The new legislation allows for the restructuring of the Oregon Health Plan to develop a Coordinated Care Organization that reins in the waste and inefficiency; promotes more efficient, effective and integrated care; and improves access to health care for all people in a community. It is hypothesized that the implementation of this program will save Oregon approximately \$1 billion over the next three years (presentations available upon request).</p>
