## SUMMARY

Information on Jackson County juvenile offenders was collected, entered and maintained in the Juvenile Justice Information System (JJIS). JJIS is a state-wide electronic case management system used by all counties in the state of Oregon and maintained by the Oregon Youth Authority.

### **Items to consider when reviewing data:**

Small changes in raw numbers between years may create large percentages. For example, a change from 6 to 2 creates a change of 67%. Review both the raw numbers and percentages to determine the significant of these changes.

### **SUMMARY**

Since 2011-2012 the department has been operating a 15 bed residential program for delinquent youth on probation. This program is for male youth between the ages of 12 and 17 years of age.

Ages 16 to 17 continue to be the highest number and percentage of youth admitted to the detention facility. 80% of admissions to the detention facility over the last ten years are male youth. White youth (76%) followed by Hispanic youth (14%) are the largest admissions by race. Probation violations (48%) are the largest admission reason for placement in detention, followed by new law violations (22%), Warrants (19%), Violations of Conditional Release (9%) and Court Order Sanction (7%).

The average daily population in detention has averaged 28 youth over the last six years. In 2013-2014 this dropped to 19. The average length of stay is approximately 10 days, which is consistent of the last 12 years.

Approximately 37% of youth entered detention only one time over the last 12 years. In 2009-2010 52% of youth entered detention only one time over 12 months. In 2013-2014 this rate was 18%. Males (80%) have consistently been admitted to detention more than females (20%).

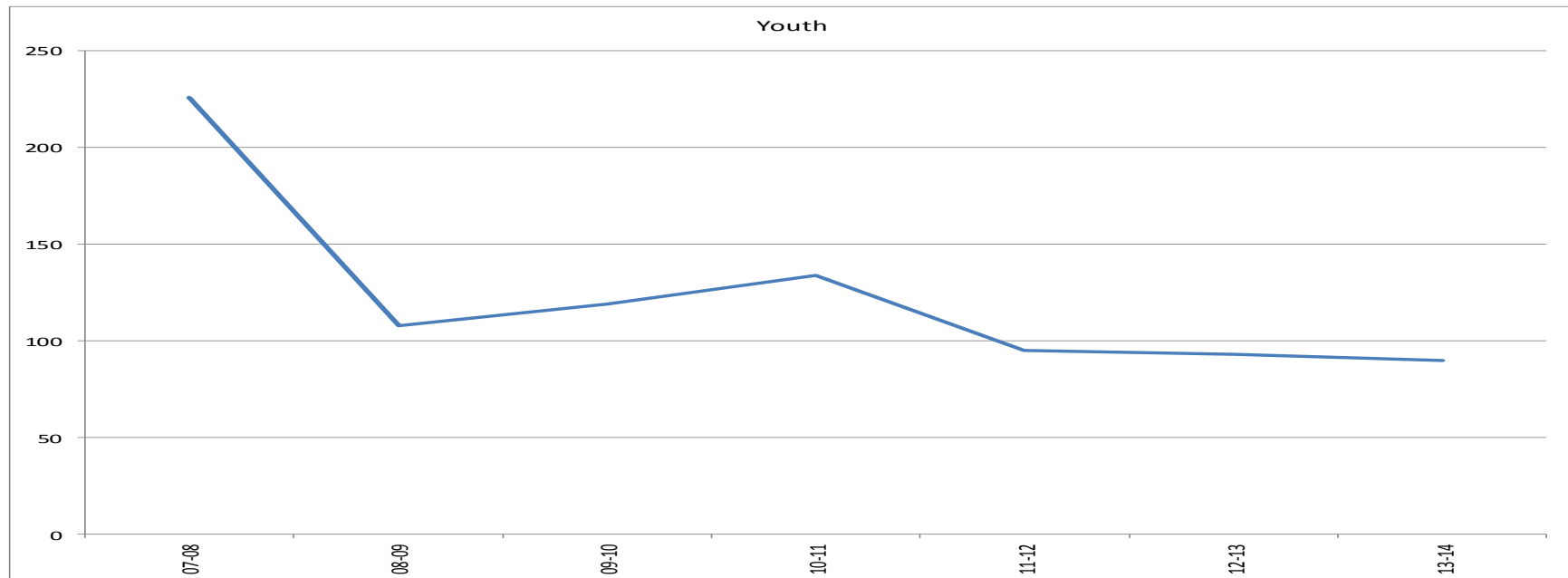
